What are the students currently learning?

Prep: Investigation Unit – My Place is Special

Student will learn...about their special places and those of the Wurundjeri people. They will explore and identify special places in their house, their school and their community. The will also learn about the Wurundjeri Country boundaries.

Grade 1: Investigation Unit – Where I live

Student will learn...about natural, managed and constructed environments and how they are formed by natural and human intervention. They will learn how features of these environments can change over time e.g. re-vegetated areas and new buildings. Students will investigate activities in the local area e.g. recreational and find them on maps as well as give reasons for their location. They will recognise that physical activities can take place in a range of different environments including natural, built and aquatic settings.

Grade 2: Investigation Unit – Water

Student will learn...about the Water Cycle and how weather affects water (evaporation, conservation, condensation).

Grade 3: Investigation Unit – Australia and the Southern Hemisphere

Student will learn...Australia's place in the world and the unique features of Australia. They will locate and research features of Australia and other Southern Hemisphere countries.

Grade 4: Investigation Unit – Living in an Australian Democracy

Student will learn...about how local government works. They learn about the Melton Council and the services it provides for its constituents. Students will learn about the election process for the Melton Council and how it relates to the election process for State and Federal Government.

Grade 5: Investigation Unit – Taking Care of Business

Student will...explore everyday money matters such as shopping lists, bank statements and personal budgets. Learning progresses to incorporate fractions and decimal algorithms into financial mathematics by investigating and understanding General Sales Tax (GST) in everyday purchases. Students will explore basic economic principles in terms of wants and needs.

Grade 6: Investigation Unit – We are Entrepreneurs

Student will learn...to become entrepreneurs. They will consider the dispositions of entrepreneurs and how these contribute to successful business enterprises. They will learn about why businesses exist; how decisions consumers make have an impact on business and the way that businesses produce, market and distribute goods and services.

Following on from our fabulous French Day we have been discussing French fashion in class. Students have learnt the story of Coco Chanel who grew up in an orphanage and changed the way we wear clothes today. We are encouraging our students to embrace and celebrate being different, to be inspired by Coco's story and dream big! Gabrielle "Coco" Chanel was always different. She vowed to prove that being different was an advantage! Tapping into her creativity and her sewing skills, she began making clothes that suited her (and her pocketbook). At first her designs were frowned upon but soon a new generation of independent working women craved her sleek, comfortable, and practical designs. Now an icon of fashion and culture, Coco Chanel continues to inspire and show just how far a person can come with big dreams, determination, and flair.

We have loved seeing our MSPS fashion designs and look forward to displaying their creations around the school.


