RESPECTIVE BEHAVIOURS WITHIN THE SCHOOL COMMUNITY:

Schools are positive places of learning and work where everyone has a right to a safe and healthy environment. Everyone in a school community plays a shared role in being respectful. When parents and carers behave aggressively towards staff or

members of the school community, it can have a significant impact on the physical and mental health, safety and wellbeing of the staff, students and other members of the school community who experience it.

When parents and carers engage in unacceptable behaviours against a staff member or another member of the school community, this can affect their health, safety and wellbeing.

Unacceptable behaviours include, but are not limited to:

-being violent or threatening violence of any kind, including physically intimidating behaviour such as aggressive hand gestures or invading another person's personal space

-speaking or behaving in a rude, aggressive or threatening way, either in person, via email, social media, or over the telephone -sending demanding, rude, confronting or threatening letters, emails or text messages

-discriminatory or derogatory comments

-the use of social media or public forums to make inappropriate or threatening remarks about the school, staff or students.

At the Principal's discretion, unacceptable behaviour may be managed by:

-implementing specific communication protocols
-written warnings
-conditions of entry to school grounds or school activities
-exclusion from school grounds or attendance at school activities
-reports to Victoria Police
-legal action
Being a role model is the most powerful form of educating.

NAPLAN Update for Year 3 & 5 Parents

The NAPLAN test window starts on Wednesday 13th March and ends on Friday 22nd March 2024. Tests will be prioritised to be scheduled at the beginning of the 8 day testing window to allow opportunities for catch-up sessions for students who are absent on scheduled test days.

In advance of doing NAPLAN Online, the public demonstration site provides sample tests to assist students to familiarise themselves with the type of questions and related functionalities available in the NAPLAN Online assessment.
