

PREP 2025 ENROLMENTS CLOSE FRIDAY 26TH July 2024

How to enrol:

- 1. Use Find my School to locate your designated neighbourhood school (referred to as your local school) and other nearby government schools.
- 2. 100-point residential address check

Any combination of the following documents is acceptable, as long as they add up to at least 100 points. (Sibling/ claim - documents not required).

Documents must show the full name of the child's parent/carer and address.

- 3. Provide a copy of birth and up to date immunisation certificate to school.
- 4. Complete **<u>pre-enrolment application</u>** form.
- 5. Return to the office completed pre-enrolment form and all supporting documents.

Parents/Guardians will then receive Student Enrolment forms.

6. Submit an enrolment application for Foundation (Prep) by Friday 26 July 2024.

- You will be notified of the outcome of your application between Monday 29 July and Friday 9 August 2024.
 If you receive an enrolment offer, you should accept the offer by Friday 23 August 2024.
- 8. Take part in information and transition sessions during Term 4, 2024.
- 9. Term 4 Enrolment pack including booklist, school fees and uniform information sent out.
 Please advise the school of any changes to contact details.
- 10. Your child will start Foundation (Prep) from Wednesday 29 January 2025. (TBC)
